## Gem Hat and Bag Yarn

ARTICLE 144

These bulky sweaters have been designed by America's top fashion creator of bulky's who knows what is smart-to-wear and quick-to-make.

She has selected Gem Hat and Bag yarn because she considers it the most practical for this type of garment.

## TheP rincess and theT ote B ag

This Hat and Tote Bag can be made with:
"GEM" HAT and BAG YARN, Article 144. 2 skeins each Brown, White and Black for Hat. 5 skeins Brown.
1 skein each White and Black for Bag. Plastic crochet hook size J.
GAUGE: $7 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}=2$ inches -7 rows $=2$ inches.

## HAT

CROWN: With Brown ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd st from hook, do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at beginning of each round.
2nd Round. 2 sc in each sc.
3rd Round. Working in sc, increase 6 s c evenly spaced. Repeat last round until work measures 6 inches in diameter. Work even until work measures 5 inches from starting point, join, cut yarn.
BAND: With Brown ch 16, draw up a loop in 2nd st from hook, then draw up a loop in each remaining st of ch, work back by drawing yarn through 1st loop, * yarn over hook and draw through 2 loops, repeat from * to end of row.
2nd Row. Draw up a loop in space between 1st and 2nd vertical bar, then draw up a loop in each remaining space between vertical bars (16 loops), work back by drawing yarn through 1st loop, * yarn over hook and draw through 2 loops, repeat from * to end of row, drop Brown (when changing color always complete last half of last st worked with next color), with White repeat the last row twice, drop White, with Brown repeat the 2nd row twice. Continue in same manner working * 2 rows Black, 2 rows Brown, 2 rows White, 2 rows Brown, repeat from * until band fits comfortably around head ending with a Black row, cut yarn. Sew short ends together. Fold band lengthwise and sew to last round of crown.

## TOTE BAG

With Brown ch 18, 3 s c in 2 nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 15 sts of $\mathrm{ch}, 3 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in last st, working on opposite side of ch, 1 sc in each of the next 15 sts , do not join this or following rounds.
2nd Round. 2 sc in each of the next 3 sts, 1 s c in each of the next $15 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sts}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 15 sts.
3rd Round. Sc in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 4 sc , 1 sc in each of the next $17 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 4 $\mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 16 s c .
4th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 17 sc , repeat from * all around.
5th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 20 s c , repeat from * all around.
6th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $8 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 21 sc , repeat from * all around.


7th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $6 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 21 s c, repeat from * all around, sl st in each of the next 2 sts to even round, turn.
8th Round. Working over entire st by inserting hook from front to back and to front again, work 1 s c over each s c, join, turn.
9th Round. 1 s c in each s c, do not join this or following rounds. Repeat the last round 32 times or until bag measures $91 / 2$ inches from 8th round, sl st in next 2 sts to even round, cut yarn.
BAND: Work same as band for hat long enough to fit around top of bag, sew short ends together, sew long edges together. Sew long edge to 3rd round from top of bag. Flatten band out and sew top edge of bag to band.
HANDLE: With Brown crochet a chain 14 inches long, s c in 2 nd st from hook, 1 s c in each remaining st of ch, ch 1, turn.
2nd Row. 1 s c in each s c, cut yarn leaving a length for sewing. Fold in half lengthwise and sew edges. Work another handle in same manner. Sew to inside of bag placing them as illustrated starting about $21 / 2$ inches down from top. Cut cardboard to fit lower part of bag. Place inside of bag.

This Hat and Bag can be made with:<br>"STAR" BLEND YARN, Article 75.<br>2 skeins Medium Blue or color desired for hat.<br>3 skeins for Bag.<br>or<br>"DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED<br>3 ozs. Med. Blue or color desired for hat. 5 ozs. for Bag.<br>Aluminum crochet hook size $F$. $1 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$. Buckram and $1 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$. lining material.

## HAT

Ch 2, 8 s c in 2nd st from hook, do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at beginning of each round.
2nd Round. Ch 1, skip 1st s c, 2 s c in next s c, * ch 1, skip 1 s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * twice.
3rd Round. Ch 1, skip the ch 1 of previous round, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, 2 s c in next s c (an increase), * ch 1, skip the ch 1 and $1 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next sc, repeat from * twice.
4th Round. * Ch 1, skip the ch 1 and $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c (pattern), repeat from * 4 times. Repeat the last round twice.
7th Round. Ch 1, 2 s c in 1st s c , ch $1,2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c (an increase), * ch 1, skip $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, repeat from * 3 times ( 6 patterns).
8th Round. * Ch 1, skip ch 1 and $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, ch 1, 2 s c in 1st s c of next pattern, ch $1,2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c of same pattern (increase), repeat from * twice (9 patterns).
9th Round. Work even in pattern.
10th Round. ** Ch 1, 2 s c in next sc. ch 1, 2 s c in next s c of same pattern, * ch 1, skip 1 s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * once, repeat from ** twice.
11th Round. Work even in pattern (12 patterns).
12th Round. Increase in every 3rd pattern. Work 1 round even in pattern (16 patterns).
14th Round. ${ }^{* *}$ Ch 1, 2 s c in next s c, ch 1, 2 s c in next s c of same pattern, * ch 1 , skip $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, repeat from * twice, repeat from ** 3 times.
15th Round. Increase 1 pattern in every 4th pattern (25 patterns). Work 1 round even in pattern.
17th Round. Increase in every 5th pattern. Work 2 rounds even.
20th Round. Increase 2 patterns evenly spaced. Work 10 rounds even in pattern, cut yarn.
TRIM: Ch 12 rather loosely, s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 4 sts of ch, 3 sc in next st, 1 s c in each of the next 5 sts of ch, ch 1, turn.
2nd Row. Working in back loop of sts throughout, skip 1 s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc, 1 sc in each of the next 4 s c, skip $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$,sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. Repeat the 2 nd row until trim is long enough to fit around lower edge of hat, cut yarn leaving an end.

## This Slipon can be made with:

"GEM" HAT and BAG YARN, Article 144.
$11(12,12)$ skeins medium Blue or color desired or
"DAWN" BULKY YARN $11(12,12)$ skeins. White or color desired.
Aluminum crochet hook size K.
8 inch zipper.
Directions are given for size 12. Sizes 14 and 16 are given in brackets.
GAUGE: $3 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}=1$ inch.

Starting at right sleeve ch $21(24,27)$, s d c in 3rd st from hook (s d c: yarn over hook, insert in st, pull loop through, yarn over and pull through all loops at one time), 1 s d c in each remaining st of ch, $20(23,26) \mathrm{s} d \mathrm{c}$, ch 2 , turn. Always count turning ch as 1 st. Increase 1 st each row by always working in first st after turning ch and working last st in turning ch.
2nd Row. Working in lower front loop of each s d c, work 1 s d c in each s d c, $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c} \mathrm{in} \mathrm{turning} \mathrm{ch} ,\mathrm{ch} \mathrm{2}, \mathrm{turn}$.
3rd Row. Working in lower back loop of sts, work 1 s d c in each s d c, 1 s d c in turning ch, ch 2, turn. Alternate these 2 rows until there are $50(53,56)$ sts including turning ch, cut yarn.
Ch $40(43,46)$ work across $50(53,56)$ sts, ch $41(44,47)$.
Next Row. Sc in 3rd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 18 sts ( 20 sts in all counting turning ch). Work next 20 $(23,26)$ sts in s d c, continue in pattern across next 50 $(53,56)$ sts of sleeve, 1 s d c in each of the next $20(23$, 26) sts of ch, 1 s c in each of the last 20 sts, ch 2, turn. In rows corresponding with row 2 of pattern st work in loop below front loop of s c for ribbing. It may be necessary to assist hook through this loop with fingers. In rows corresponding with 3rd row of pattern work in back loop of each sc.
To work even rows omit working in first scof each row but continue to work last scin turning ch. Work even for 13 $(15,17)$ rows always working 1st 20 sts and last 20 sts in s c , remaining sts in pattern as before.
Next Row. Fold work in half and mark center of shoulder, then work in pattern decreasing 1 st at center of shoulder (to decrease: * insert hook in next st, pull loop through, repeat from * once, yarn over and work off all loops at one time). Repeat the last row 3 times.
NECK: Fold work in half and mark center of shoulder, count 10 sts to back and attach yarn, ch 35 , skip 35 sts, sl st in next st, cut yarn. This is for front of neck.

Sew both short ends together placing the 3 s c directly in corner of starting ch. Sew one long side of trim around lower edge of hat. Turn opposite side of trim upwards and sew along the same line. Roll upward in position.
CUFF AROUND TOP: Ch 10 rather loosely, scin 2nd st from hook, 1 sc in each of the next 3 sts of ch, 3 s c in next st, 1 sc in each of the next 4 sts of ch, ch 1, turn.
2nd Row. Working in back loop of sts, skip $1 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $4 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s c, 1 sc in each of the next 3 s c, skip 1 s c, s c in last s c, ch 1, turn. Repeat the last row 32 times ( 17 ribs), cut yarn. Sew short ends together, then sew long sides together to form a roll. Sew around top of hat as illustrated.

## BAG

Ch 24, 3 sc in 2nd st from hook, 1 sc in each of the next 21 sts of ch, 3 s c in next st, working on other side of ch, 1 sc in each of the next 21 sts , join in 1st s c.
2nd Round. Ch 1 and work 2 sc in same space, 2 sc in each of the next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $21 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$, $c$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each remaining $\mathrm{s} c$, join in 1st sc.
3rd Round. ch 1, 2 s c in same space, * 1 s c in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, repeat from * once, 1 sc in each of the next 22 sc , * 2 sc in next sc, 1 sc in next s c, repeat from * twice, 1 s c in each remaining 21 s c , join ( 60 sc ).
4th Round. 1 sc in each scon sides increasing 3 s c evenly spaced around each end, join each round.
5th Round. Work even in sc.
6th Round. Same as 4th round.
7th and 8th Rounds. 1 sc in each scon sides increasing 4 sts evenly spaced at each end in each round.
9th Round. Working in back loop of sts only, work 1 sc in each s c (88 s c).
10th Round. Working through both loops of sts, ch 1, 2 s c in next s c, * ch 1 , skip $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s}$ c in next s c, ch 1, skip $2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, repeat from * all around, do not join this or the following rounds, place a marker at beginning of each round.
11th Round. Ch 1, skip 1st s c of previous round, 2 s c in next sc, * ch 1, skip the ch 1 and 1 s c, 2 s c in next s c (pattern), repeat from * all around.
12th Round. * Ch 1, skip next ch 1 and $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c , repeat from * all around. Repeat the last round 25 times, then ch 1 , sl st in 2 nd st of 1st pattern to even round.
Next Round. BEADING: Ch 4, tr c in same space, * ch 1, skip ch 1 and $1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{tr} \mathrm{c}$ in next sc, repeat from * all around, ch 1, join in 4th st of ch.

Next Round. Ch 1, 2 s c in next tr c, * ch 1, skip 1 tr c, 2 s c in next tr c, repeat from * all around, do not join rounds. Work 4 rounds in pattern.
Next Round. 1 sc in each scand 1 sc in back loop of each ch 1, join, cut yarn.
CUFF FOR LOWER EDGE: Ch 10, s c in 2nd st from hook, 1 s c in each of the next 3 sts of ch, 3 s c in next st, 1 sc in each of the next 4 sts of ch, ch 1 , turn.
2nd Row. Working in back loop of sts, skip $1 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $4 \mathrm{sc}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} c, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 3 s c, skip 1 s c, s c in last s c, ch 1, turn. Repeat the last row 78 times ( 40 ribs), cut yarn. Sew both short ends together placing the 3 s c directly in corner of starting ch. Sew side edges together to form a roll.
CORD: Crochet a ch about 32 inches long, sl st in 2nd st from hook, 1 sl st in each remaining st of ch, cut yarn. Work another cord in same manner.
FINISHING: Cut a stiff cardboard same shape as bottom. Cut a piece of buckram and lining same shape as cardboard. Cut a strip of buckram $31 / 2$ inches in width and long enough to go around bottom. Sew strip of buckram to bottom section of buckram. Place cardboard next to buckram. Cut lining to fit entire bag and sew in position on inside of bag. Lace cord through beading starting each cord on opposite side and lacing over 4 tr c and under next 4 tr c. Sew ends together.
Sew roll in position around bag, sewing about $3 / 4$ inch above lower edge.

LEFT SIDE: Next Row. Work in pattern working 1 s d c in sts in which ch was joined and in each st of ch.
Next Row. Work in pattern across next $62(65,68)$ sts, increase in next st, work across remaining sts.
Next Row. Work in pattern across next $63(66,69)$ sts, increase in next st, work across remaining sts. Work 2 more rows increasing in center st of each row. Work even in pattern for $13(15,17)$ rows, cut yarn.
LEFT SLEEVE: Attach yarn in 41st (44th, 47th) st from edge and work in pattern over next $50(53,56)$ sts for sleeve leaving $40(43,46)$ sts for underarm. Work in pattern decreasing 1 st each row for $30(33,36)$ rows (to decrease: do not work in 1st st and do not work st in turning ch).
Next Row. 1 sl st in each st, cut yarn. Finish edge of opposite sleeve in same manner.
NECK FINISHING: Attach yarn at center front and work a row of sl sts all around, cut yarn.
Sew side and sleeve seams leaving an 8 inch opening on left side for zipper. Sew zipper in position.

This jacket can be made with:
"GEM" HAT and BAG YARN, Article 144.
$12(13,14)$ skeins Pink or any color desired.
or
"DAWN" BULKY YARN $12(13,14)$ skeins Shell Pink. Wooden crochet hook No. 13 and aluminum crochet hook size G.
4-1 $1 / 4$ inch pearl buttons.
Directions are given for size 12. Sizes 14 and 16 are given in brackets.
GAUGE: With No. 13 hook $31 / 2$ sts $=1$ inch- 6 ridges $=2$ inches. With size G hook 5 sts $=1$ inch.
1st Row. With No. 13 hook ch 27 (29, 31), sl st in 2nd st from hook, 1 sl st in each remaining st of ch, $27(29,31)$ sts (turning ch is always counted as 1 st), ch 1 to turn all rows.
2nd Row. 1 sl st in each sl st and in ch 1 at end of row (an increase). Repeat last row always increasing 1 st in each row until there are $83(85,87)$ sts counting the turning ch as a stitch, cut yarn, turn. With G hook ch 10, with No. 13 hook ch $14(15,16)$, then work across the $83(85,87)$ sts, ch $14(15,16)$, change to size G hook and ch 11 .
Next Row. SI st in 2nd st from hook, sl st in each of the next 9 sts (10 sts for ribbing), change to No. 13 hook and sl st in each of the next $111(115,119)$ sts, change to size G hook and sl st in each of the next 10 sts (ribbing). All ribbing is worked with size $G$ hook and will not be referred to again. Continue working even (to work even do not work in turning ch) until waist band measures 5 ( $5^{1 / 4}, 5 \frac{1}{2}$ ) inches on each side finishing what will be the back edge.
Next Row. Work next $61(63,66)$ sts including waistband, ch 1, turn and work back to lower edge.
*Next Row. Work to within 2 sts of last row, turn, do not ch 1, then work back to lower edge. Repeat from * once.

Work even until waist band measures $71 / 2(73 / 8,8)$ inches ending at back edge.
Next Row. SL st in each st, ch 3, turn.
Next Row. SI st in 2nd st from hook, sl st in next st of ch, sl st in each remaining sl st. Repeat the last 2 rows once.
Next Row. SI st in each st, ch $71(73,74)$, working last 11 sts of ch with size G hook, turn.
Next Row. SI st in 2nd st from hook, sl st in each remaining st of ch, sl st in each sl st.
Next Row. SI st in each st. Continue to work even until this side corresponds to opposite side, cut yarn, turn.
Next Row. Skip $23(24,25)$ sl sts, attach yarn in next st, then work 1 sl st in each of the next $83(85,87)$ sts, leaving next $24(25,26)$ sts for underarm seam, ch 1 , turn.
Next Row. Decrease 1 st at the beginning of row (to decrease: skip 1 st and do not work in turning ch). Repeat last row until there are $27(29,31)$ sts, cut yarn. Sew side and sleeve seams.
NECK AND FRONT BAND: With right side of work toward you attach yarn at lower edge of front, and work 1 sl st in each st to short row at back of neck, * 1 sl st in short row, 1 sl st in decreased row, repeat from * once, sl st in each ridge across back of neck, * sl st in next decrease row, sl st in next row, repeat from * once, sl st in each st on opposite side (there will be a variation in appearance of pattern where band and fronts are joined but this cannot be avoided). Work even until front ribbing measures 6 (6 $1 / 2,7$ ) inches ending at right front edge.
Next Row. 1 sl st in each of the 1st 2 sts, ch 5 , skip 5 sts, sl st in next st, * work in sl st for $2 \frac{1}{4}$ inches, ch 3 , skip 3 sts, sl st in next st, repeat from * twice, then sl st in each remaining st. Work even in sl sts until ribbing measures 7 ( $71 / 2,8$ ) inches, cut yarn.
Sew buttons in position.

This Hat and Bag can be made with:
"GEM" HAT and BAG YARN, Article 144.
2 skeins Red or any color desired for hat.
4 skeins Red for bag.
5 skeins will make entire set.
Aluminum crochet hook size G.

## HAT

Ch 5, join to form a ring, ch 1 and work 8 s c in ring, do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at the beginning of each round.
2nd and 3rd Rounds. * 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * all around.
4th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s $c$, repeat from * all around. Work 1 round even.
6th Round. Working in s c, increase in every 4th st. Work 1 round even.

8th Round. Increase in every 5th st (36 sts), Work 1 round even.
10th Round. Increase in every 3rd st. Work 1 round even. 12th Round. Increase in every 6th st. Work 1 round even. 14th Round. Increase in every 7th st. Work 4 rounds even.
19th Round. Increase in every 16th st. Work 2 rounds even.
22nd Round. Increase in every 17th st. Work 4 rounds even.
27th Round. SI st in each st, join, cut yarn.
TASSEL: Wind yarn 10 times over a $21 / 2$ inch cardboard cut one end, tie in center, then tie about $1 / 2$ inch down from top. Trim tassel. Work 2 more tassels in the same manner. Sew to hat as illustrated.

This Hat and Bag can be made with:
"GEM" HAT and BAG YARN, Article 144.
2 skeins Med. Blue or color desired for hat.
4 skeins Med. Blue for bag.
Aluminum crochet hook size F.

## HAT

Ch 2, 6 s c in 2nd st from hook, join in 1st s c.
2nd Round. * Ch 1, s c in next s c, repeat from * all around, do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at beginning of each round.
3rd Round. * Ch $1,1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$, ch $1,1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, repeat from * all around.
4th Round. * Ch 1, s c in next s c, ch 1, s c in same space (an increase), ch $1, \mathrm{~s} c$ in next s c , repeat from * all around.
5th Round. * Ch 1, s c in next s c (pattern), repeat from * all around.

6th Round. Working in pattern increase in every 3rd s c.
7th Round. Same as 5th round.
8th Round. Same as 6th round.
9th Round. Increase in every 4th s c. Work 1 round even in pattern.
11th Round. Working in pattern, increase twice in round.
Next 7 Rounds. Work even in pattern.

Next Round. Ch 1, s c in same space, * ch 1, s c in next tr c, repeat from * all around. Without joining rounds work 4 rounds even in pattern, ch 1 and join last round. Next Round. Ch 2, s c in same space, * 1 s c , ch $2,1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, repeat from * all around, join, cut yarn. DRAW STRING: Crochet a ch about 30 inches long, sl st in 2nd st from hook, 1 sl st in each remaining st of ch, cut yarn. Work another string in same manner. Lace through beading starting each string on opposite side and lacing over 2 tr c and under next 2 tr c. Sew ends together. Cut a cardboard about $61 / 2$ inches in diameter. 4th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 17 sc , repeat from * all around.
5th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $5 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 20 sc , repeat from * all around.
6th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $8 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 21 s c , repeat from * all around.
7th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 3 s c, 2 s c in next sc, 1 sc in each of the next 21 s c, repeat from * all around, join, ch 1, turn.

8th Round. Work over entire st by inserting hook from front to back and to front again, work 1 s c over each s c, join, ch 1, turn.
9th Round. 1 s c in each s c, do not join this or following rounds.
Next 26 Rounds. 1 sc in each sc, join, cut yarn.
Next Round. Fold work in half. With work facing you, place a marker at end st on left hand side, counting back attach yarn in 16th st from end st, s c in same space, working forward ch 4 , skip 4 sts, 1 sc in each of the next 6 sts, ch 4 , skip 4 sts, 1 s c in each of the next 3 sts, ch 4 , skip 4 sts, 1 sc in each of the next 6 sts, ch 4 , skip 4 sts, 1 s c in each of the next 12 sts, ch 4 , skip 4 st.s, 1 s c in each of the next 6 sts, ch 4 , skip 4 sts, 1 s c in each of the next 3 sts, ch 4 , skip 4 sts, 1 s c in each of the next 6 sts, ch 4, skip 4 sts, 1 s c in each remaining st, do not join this or following rounds.
Next Round. Work 4 s c over each ch 4 loop and 1 s c in each sc.
Next 3 Rounds. Work even in s c. Next Round. SI st in each st, cut yarn.
DRAW STRING: Crochet a chain about 40 inches long, sl st in 2 nd st from hook, 1 sl st in each remaining st of ch, cut yarn leaving a length for sewing. Lace through 4 holes on one side, then lace through the 4 holes on opposite side. Sew ends together.
Make 4 tassels same as tassels for hat. Sew to bag as illustrated.

If working with "Dawn" Bulky Yarn use Crimson in place of Med. Blue and Black in place of National Blue.
BACK: 1st row: With White on \#10 needles, cast on 60 $(66,72)$ sts, work in pattern as follows: * K $10(11,12), \mathrm{Y}$ O, repeat from * 4 times, K $10(11,12)$.
2nd Row: *P 10 (11, 12), slip yarn over from previous row off needle, make a new Y O, repeat from * 4 times, P 10 (11, 12).
3rd Row: * K $10(11,12)$ slip Y O from previous row off needle, make a new Y O, repeat from * 4 times, K 10 (11, 12). Slipped Y O's produce ladder over which vertical stripes will be worked later with crochet hook. Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows for $13(13,14)$ rows in all, cut yarn. Attach National Blue and work 1 row across in pattern, cut yarn. Continue in same manner until 5 National Blue stripes are completed.
UNDERARM: Continue working in same manner, bind off 3 sts at beginning of next 2 rows, 1 st at beginning of next 8 rows, $46(52,58)$ sts. Work even in pattern until armhole measures $7 \frac{1}{2}$ inches from underarm.
SHOULDERS: Bind off $6(7,8)$ sts at beginning of next 2 rows, then bind off $7(8,9)$ sts at beginning of next 2 rows. Leave center $20(22,24)$ sts on st holder for collar to be picked up later.
LEFT FRONT: With White on \#4 needles cast on 6 sts, with same yarn on \#10 needles cast on $30(33,36)$ sts.
1st Row: * K $10(11,12)$ sts, Y O, repeat from * twice, with \#4 needles * P 1, K 1, repeat from * twice across border sts, always work border sts with White only with No. 4 needles and remaining sts with No. 10 needles.

2nd Row: * P 1, K 1, repeat from * twice, * slip Y O, make a new Y O as on back, P $10(11,12)$ repeat from * twice. Work in pattern until front measures same as back to underarm ending at front edge.
YOKE: With \#4 needles * P 1, K 1, repeat from * 7 times, discontinue Y O next to border sts, work in pattern to end of row.
Next Row: Bind off 3 sts at armhole edge. Then decrease 1 st at armhole edge every other row four times, 29 (32, 35) sts. Work stripes and Y O's in pattern except through yoke until armhole measures same as on back ending at armhole edge.
Next Row-Shoulder: Bind off $6(6,7)$ sts at beginning of row. Work 1 row even.
Next Row: Bind off $6(6,7)$ sts at beginning of row, place remaining $17(20,21)$ sts on holder for collar.
RIGHT FRONT: Work right front to correspond to left front, working a buttonhole on front band even with each National Blue stripe including 2 buttonholes in yoke ( 7 buttonholes). To make a buttonhole, knit 3rd and 4th st from edge together, Y O. On following row K the Y O of previous row over buttonhole as a stitch.
SLEEVES: With White on \#10 needles cast on $28(30,32)$ sts. Work entire sleeve in ribbing (K 1, P 1). Work even for 2 inches.
Next Row: Increase 1 st each side. Then increase 1 st each side every $1 \frac{1}{2}$ inches until there are $50(52,51)$ sts. Work even until sleeve measures $17(18,19)$ inches or length desired.
Next 2 Rows: Bind off $6(7,8)$ sts at beginning of each row. Then bind off 1 st at beginning of every row until 24 sts remain. Bind off 3 sts at beginning of next 4 rows, bind off remaining 12 sts. Block each section. Sew shoulder seams.
COLLAR: With wrong side toward you on \#4 needles, starting with front band, pick up $17(20,21)$ sts from holder, pick up $20(22,24)$ sts from back holder and remaining sts from other front. Work even on $54(62,66)$ sts in ribbing, (if necessary decrease 1 st at back of neck in order to keep ribbing even on front yoke) for 5 inches. Bind off in ribbing.
VERTICAL STRIPES: With right side of work toward you, using size G hook attach Med. Blue at bottom of 1st ladder, draw up a loop on hook, holding yarn from wrong side of work, insert hook in next ladder, draw up a loop and pull through loop on hook (chain st worked over ladder). Adjust tension of chain to match knitting. Work chain sts up all ladders. Weave all ends in.
FINISHING: Sew side seams leaving one block free at lower edge. With Med. Blue, work chain st over side seams. Sew sleeve seams and sew sleeves in position. LOWER EDGE: With White, work a row of sl sts across edge, working up and down each slit on sides, cut yarn.
2nd Row: Attach yarn at opposite side and work another row of sl sts through center of sl sts of 1st row, skip 2 sts at top of slit at either side.
Sew buttons in position.

RIGHT FRONT: Next Row. Work in pattern across 49 (53, 57) sts, place remaining sts on a holder, drop yarn. Using a separate pair of needles and separate skein of yarn cast on $30(32,34)$ sts for front starting with a knit st, work in pattern for 4 rows.
On 5th row bind off loosely $7(7,7)$ sts in pattern at beginning of row for back neck band, cut yarn leaving an end to sew. The remaining sts are part of front. With shoulder needle work across the next $23(25,27)$ sts, 72 $(78,84)$ sts on needle. Work even until sleeve measures $13(14,14)$ inches at cuff edge.
Next Row. Bind off $15(17,19)$ sts, work even to end of row.
Next Row. Work even across row.
Next Row. Decrease 1 st at beginning of row (side edge). Repeat the last 2 rows twice. Work even for 5 ( 5 ½, 5 ½) inches ending at side edge.
Next Row. Decrease 1 st at beginning of row. Work even for 5 ( $5,5 \frac{1}{2}$ ) inches.
Next Row. Decrease 1 st at side edge. Work even until front measures same as back, bind off.
LEFT FRONT: Slip sts from stitch holder on left hand needle to begin working from neck edge. Attach yarn and bind off 13 sts loosely for back of neck, drop yarn. With separate pair of needles cast on $30(32,34)$ sts for left front, * P 1, K 1, repeat from * across row.
Next 3 Rows. Work even in pattern.
5th Row. Bind off $7(7,7)$ sts at beginning of row for back of neck.

With shoulder needle work across remaining $23(25,27)$ sts. Work same as right front reversing the shaping.
POCKET: Cast on 25 sts and work even in pattern for 6 inches, bind off. Work another pocket in same manner. Sew underarm and side seams. Sew back neck bands together and sew to back of neck. Sew pockets in position as illustrated. Crochet a row of s c across lower edge of fronts.

With Yellow, ch 6, 3 dtr c (3 times over hook) in 6th st from hook leaving last loop of each dtrc on hook, thread over and work off all loops at one time, * ch $9,3 \mathrm{dtr} \mathrm{c}$ in 6th st from hook leaving last loop of each dtr c on hook, thread over and work off all loops at one time (cluster st), repeat from * 34 times or until long enough to fit across the 2 inch velvet ribbon, cut thread.
2nd Row. Attach Green in same space, ch 11 and working across side of cluster sts, work 1 s c in each of the next 3 ch sts between cluster sts, * ch $11,1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in each of the next 3 ch sts between next 2 cluster sts, repeat from * across side ending with ch $11, \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in end, working on opposite side of cluster sts, repeat from 1st * across side. 3rd Row. 14 s c over 1st loop, sl st in center scof the 3 s c group, * 14 s c over next loop, sl st in center s c of next 3 s c group, repeat from * all around working a sl st in scat each end, cut thread.
Press under a damp cloth. Turn end of 2 inch velvet under to form a point and sew. Finish opposite end in same manner. Sew hook and eye in position at points.
Sew crocheted strip across center of velvet as illustrated. Center for bow. With Yellow, ch 8, join to form a ring, ch 3 and work 23 dc in ring, join.

2nd Row. Picking up front loop of sts, work 1 s c in each of the next $7 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 7 sc , ch 1, turn.
3rd Row. Working through back loop of sts and working in sc , increase in every 3rd scending with 1 sc in each of the last 3 s c , ch 1, turn.
4th Row. Working through front loop of sts, work 1 s c in each s c, ch 1, turn. All even numbered rows pick up front loop of sts and all uneven numbered rows pick up
back loop of sts throughout, this will not be referred to again.

Attach White, ch 3, 2 dc in same space, sc in ch 2 loop of next shell, * ch 2, 2 d c in same space, s c in ch 2 loop of next shell, repeat from * 11 times, ch 7 , skip the scin center of ch 7 loop, scin next sc, * ch $2,2 \mathrm{~d}$ c in same space, s c in ch 2 loop of next shell, repeat from * twice, ch 3, turn.
4th Row. 2 d c in same space, s c in ch 2 loop of next shell, * ch 2, 2 d c in same space, s c in ch 2 loop of next shell, repeat from * once, ch 3, s c in next ch 7 loop, ch 3, sc in next sc,* ch 2, 2 d c in same space, sch in ch 2 loop of next shell, repeat from * 12 times, ch 3, turn.

With Black, ch 13, 2 dc in 4th st from hook, skip 2 sts of ch, sc in next st, * ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same space (shell), skip 2 sts of ch, s c in next st, repeat from * once, ch 3, turn.
2nd Row. 2 d c in same space, scin ch 2 loop of next shell, ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same space, s c in ch 2 loop of next shell, ch $2,2 \mathrm{~d}$ c in same space, insert hook in ch 2 loop of next shell, pull loop through, drop Black, pick up White and complete the s c, ch 3, turn.
3rd Row. 2 d c in same space, s c in loop of next shell, * ch $2,2 \mathrm{dc}$ in same space, sc in loop of next shell, repeat from * once, ch 3, turn. Continue working in shell st pattern having 3 shells in each row working 1 more row White, drop White (when changing color always complete last half of st with next color), * 2 rows Black, 2 rows White, repeat from* 19 times or until piece is long enough to go around lower edge of hat, cut thread.

Ch 3, 2 d c in same space, ch 2, 3 d c in next dc , skip $1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{d} \mathrm{c}$ around entire post of next d c, * skip 1 d c, 3 d c in next d c, ch 2, 3 d c in next d c, skip $1 \mathrm{~d} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{d}$ c around entire post of next d c , repeat from * all around, join in 3rd st of ch.

Left Glove-Work 1st 14 rows same as for right palm marking the 1st row as right side of glove.
15th Row-Skip I s c, 1 s c in each of the next 43 s c , fold thumb sts so that thumb is on wrong side of palm, skip 1 s c, turn, insert hook in s c just worked and in s c after skipped s c and work a sl st. Complete thumb joining and finish to correspond to right palm.
Back-Work same as right back marking 1st row as wrong side of glove.
Finish same as right glove.

2 skeins White for hat and
2 skeins White for bag.

## HAT

With White, ch 2 , 8 s c in 2 nd st from hook, do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at the beginning of each round.
2nd Round. 2 sc in each sc.

3rd Round. * 1 s c in next s c, 2 s c in next s c, repeat from * all around.
4th Round. Working in sc, increase in every 3rd st.
5th Round. Increase in every 4th st.
6th Round. Increase in every 5th st.
7th Round. Increase in every 6th st. Work 1 round even. 9th Round. Increase in every 7th st. Work 1 round even. 11th Round. Increase in every 8th st.
12th Round. Increase 4 sts evenly spaced. Work 7 rounds even, sl st in last 2 sts at end of last round to even round, cut yarn.

20th Round. Attach Blue in any st, scin same space, d tr c (3 times over hook) in next st, * s c in next st, d tr c in next st, repeat from * all around, join, cut yarn.
21st Round. Attach White and work 1 s c in each st, join, cut yarn.

23rd Round. Same as 21st round.

With White ch $18,3 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in 2 nd st from hook, 1 sc in each of the next 15 sts of ch, 3 s c in last st, working on opposite side of ch, 1 sc in each of the next 15 sts , do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at the beginning of each round.
2nd Round. 2 sc in each of the next 3 sts, 1 sc in each of the next $15 \mathrm{sts}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sts}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 15 sts.
3rd Round. Sc in next sc, 2 s c in each of the next 4 sc c, 1 sc in each of the next $17 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 4 $\mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 16 sc .
4th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 17 sc , repeat from * all around.
5th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $5 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 20 sc , repeat from * all around.
6th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $8 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 21 s c , repeat from* all around.
7th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $3 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $2 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s}, 1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in each of the
next 3 s c, 2 s c in next sc, 1 s c in each of the next 21 s c, repeat from * all around.
8th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s c, 1 sc in each of the next $8 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next $\mathrm{s} c, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next $2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next sc, 1 s c in each of the next 21 s c, repeat from * all around.
9th Round. * 1 sc in each of the next $9 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{sc}$ in next s $\mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in each of the next $12 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in each of the next 24 sc , repeat from * all around.
10th Round. * 1 s c in each of the next $13 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next sc, 1 sc in each of the next $6 \mathrm{sc}, 2 \mathrm{~s} \mathrm{c}$ in next sc, 1 sc in each of the next 28 sc , repeat from * all around, sl st in each of the next 2 sts to even round, turn.
11th Round. Working over entire st by inserting hook from front to back and to front again, work 1 s c over each s c , join, cut yarn, turn.
Next 5 Rounds. Same as 20th, 21st, 22nd, 23rd and 24th rounds of hat.
17th Round. Attach White and work 1 s c in each st, do not join this or following rounds.
Next 13 Rounds. 1 s c in each sc.
31st Round. Decrease 10 sts evenly spaced.
Next 7 Rounds. Work even in sc.
Next Round. Decrease 10 sts evenly spaced.
Next 5 Rounds. Work even in s c, sl st in last 2 sts at end of last round to even round.
Next Round. BEADING. Ch 7, skip $2 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{d}$ tr c in next s c, * ch 2, skip 2 s c, $\mathrm{d} \operatorname{tr} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c, repeat from * all around, ch 2, join in 5th st of ch 7.
Next Round. Ch 1, s c in same space then work 2 s c in each mesh and 1 s c in each dtr c , do not join this or following rounds.
Next 2 Rounds. 1 sc in each sc.
Next Round. * S c in next s c, d tr c in next s c, repeat from * all around.
Next Round. SI st in each st, join, cut yarn.
DRAW STRING: With White, crochet a chain about 30 inches long, sl st in 2nd st from hook, 1 sl st in each remaining st of ch, cut yarn. Attach Blue at one end, s c in same space, ch 3 , sl st in same space, cut yarn. With Black, work other end in same manner. Work another draw string in same manner. Lace through beading, lacing over 1 dtr c and under next dtr c. Lace other draw string starting at opposite side. Knot ends of draw string together.



This Crocheted Stocking Cap with Beads can be made with: "DAWN" NYLON of KNITTING WORSTED SIZE

## or

"DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED.
3 ozs. Flame or color desired. Plastic crochet hook, size J same as size 9. 125 medium size pearl beads.
GAUGE: 2 rows = 1 inch.
Cap is worked rather loosely throughout. Ch 4, join to form a ring, ch 1 and work 8 s c in ring, join. 2nd Round: * Insert hook in next s c, pull loop up $1 / 2$ inch, yarn over and pull through both loops on hook, the stitch will now have a single thread at back of loop, insert hook under the single thread, yarn over and pull loop through (2 loops on hook), yarn over and pull through both loops at one time, repeat from * 7 times, do not join this or the following rounds. Place a marker at beginning of each round.
3rd Round: Draw up a $1 / 2$ inch loop on hook, yarn over and pull through loop forming a ch, s c over single loop of st, sc in next s c (single knot st), repeat from * 7 times.
4th Round: * Work a single knot st, s c in next s c, repeat from * all around (8 single knot sts).

5th Round: * Work a single knot st, s c in next s c, work a single knot st, s c in next s c, work a single knot st, s c in same s c (an increase), repeat from * 3 times (12 single knot sts).
6th \& 7th Rounds: Work even.
8th Round: Increase 1 single knot st after every 3rd single knot st ( 16 single knot sts). Work 7 rounds even.
Next 25 Rounds: Work even, but draw up loops about 1 inch.
41st Round: Turn work to wrong side and * work 1 s c in long loop and 1 s c in scof same knot st, 1 s c in next sc, repeat from * all around, join (48 s c).
42nd Round: 1 s c in each s c, join, turn.
43rd Round: 1 s c in each s c, join, cut yarn.
FINISHING: Starting at top of cap, sew on 22 pearls close together forming a large marble size knot. Sew remainder of pearls over the 1st 12 rounds sewing over the s c of knot sts placing pearls about 1 inch apart.
Other jewelry, like sequins, rhinestones, or decorative buttons can be substituted for pearls.
Cap can be worn in different ways as follows: roll back to form a turban, or for cold days wrap end around neck and fasten on opposite side.

"DAWN" KNITTING WORSTED
6 ozs. National Blue or color desired.
1 oz . White or any contrasting color.
1 pr. knitting needles No. 6.
GAUGE: 5 sts in stockinette st = 1 inch.
With White, cast on 96 sts and work in ribbing of $\mathrm{K} 2, \mathrm{P} 2$ for 4 rows.
5th Row: Attach National Blue K 2, with White P 2, * with Blue K 2, with White P 2, repeat from * across row (right side of work).
6th Row: Keeping the yarn in front of work, * with White K 2, with Blue P 2, repeat from * across row.
7th Row: Keeping the yarn in back of work, * with White K 2, with Blue P 2, repeat from * across row.

8th Row: Keeping the yarn in front of work, * with Blue K 2, with White P 2, repeat from * across row. Repeat the last 4 rows once, then repeat the 5th and 6th rows once, cut White.
15th Row: With Blue $P$ across row.
16th Row: K across row. Work in stockinette st (K 1 row, $P 1$ row) until work measures 4 inches from beginning ending with a P row.
Next Row: * K across row decreasing 6 sts evenly spaced. Work even in stockinette st for 3 inches ending with a P row. Repeat from * 9 times ( 36 sts left).
Next Row: K 2 sts tog. across row, cut yarn leaving an end. Thread into needle and draw through remaining sts, fasten securely. Sew back seam.
TASSEL: Wind Blue and White over a 9 inch cardboard about 70 times, tie one end. Cut other end. Tie again about $1 \frac{1}{2}$ inches from top. Sew to cap as illustrated.

Place a marker at beginning of each round.

4 skeins Bronze Gold
$13 / 4$ yds. 1 inch grosgrain ribbon.
15 -inch plastic square.
Steel crochet hook No. 1
Aluminum crochet hook size G.
With No. 1 hook, attach yarn in any corner hole of plastic square, 3 s c in same space, * ch 1, 2 s c in next hole, repeat from * to hole before next corner hole, ch 1, 3 sc in corner hole, continue all around in same manner ending to correspond, join in 1st s c.
2nd Round. Change to size G hook, ch 1, s c in same space, 3 sc in next $\mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}, \mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}$ in next s c , then work 1 sc in each s c and 3 s c in each corner s c, do not join this or following rounds. Place a marker at the beginning of each round.
3rd Round. * S c in next s c, tr c in next sc (keep tr c to front of work), repeat from * all around.
4th Round. $\operatorname{Tr} \mathrm{c}$ in next st, scin next st, repeat from * all around. Repeat the 3rd and 4th rounds 9 times.
Next Round. Beading: Ch 7, skip 2 sts, d tr c (3 times over hook) in next st, * ch 2, skip 2 sts, $d \operatorname{tr} \mathrm{c}$ in next st, repeat from * all around ending with ch 2, join in 5th st of ch 7.

Next Round. Ch 1, s c in same space, then work 2 s c in each mesh and 1 s c in each d tr c , do not join this or following rounds. Work 4 rounds even in sc.

Next Row. Ch 1 and work 1 sc in each sc, join.

Next Round. With Green work 1 sc in each st.
Next 26 Rounds. 1 s c in each sc, sl st in next 2 sts at end of last round to even rounds.
Next Round. Beading: Ch 5, skip 1 st, tr c in next st, * ch 1, skip 1 st, tr c in next st, repeat from * all around ending with ch 1, join in 4th st of ch 5.

4th Round. 1 s c in each s c on sides increasing 3 s c evenly spaced around each end. Repeat the last round twice.

11th Round. Ch 1 and work 1 sc in eye and 1 sc in loop of each star st (84 s c), join.
12th and 13th Rounds. Same as 10th and 11th rounds. 14th Round. 1 s c in each s c, do not join. Repeat the last round 21 times.
Repeat the 10th, 11th, 12th and 13th rounds once.

Work 6 more rounds in same manner increasing 1 s c at each of 6 increasing points and having 1 more s c between increasing points in each round (6 increases in each round).
11th Round. 1 sc in each s c increasing 1 sc in round ( 61 s c ), sl st in next st to even round.
12th Round. Working rather loosely, work same as 10th round of bag but having 31 star sts in round, do not join this or following rounds.

13th Round. 1 s c in loop and 1 s c in eye of each star st ( 62 s c ).
Next 2 Rounds. 1 sc in each sc.
16th Round. 1 s c in each s c increasing 2 s c evenly spaced, sl st in next st.
17th Round. Same as 12th round but having 32 star sts in round.
18th Round. Start Brim: * s c in loop of next star st, scin eye of same star st, scin loop of next star st, scin eye of same star st, 2 s c in loop of next star st (an increase), s c in eye of same star st, repeat from * all around ending to correspond, sl st in 1st s c.
Next Round. Work in star stitch pattern same as 12th round until there are 29 star stitch patterns, s c in next s c, 1 sl st in each of the next 13 sc (back of hat), sc in next s $\mathrm{c}, \mathrm{s} \mathrm{c}$ in 2 nd st of ch 2.
Next Row. * 1 sc in loop and 1 s c in eye of next star st, 1 sc in loop and 1 sc in eye of next star st, 2 s c in loop of next star st, 1 s c in eye of same star st, 1 s c in loop and 1 sc in eye of next star st, 1 sc in loop of next star st, 2 s c in eye of same star st, repeat from * across star sts only, ending to correspond, then sl st in next s c, do not work across back of hat, ch 1, turn.
Next Row. Skip the sl st, 1 s c in each sc working through front loop of sts only, sl st in last s c, do not work across sl sts at back of hat, ch 1, turn.
Next Row. Working through both loops of sts, skip the sl st and work 1 sc in each sc, sl st in last s c, do not work across back of hat, ch 1, turn. Repeat the last row once, cut yarn. Sew under the last 3 rows of brim.
Sew a bead in eye of each star stitch as illustrated or with Brown, embroider a French knot in eye of each star st.
